**Students Satisfaction Survey Feedback Analysis Report - 2023-24**

The college has collected feedback from the students. Google Form is being used for this purpose (Link - <https://forms.gle/2k5yUUfrzNaq7pMn9>). We have received feedback of 122 students. Out of which 55.7% are male students and 44.3% female students submitted their feedback of academic year 2023-24. 91.8% students were from under graduate classes & 8.2% students were from postgraduate classes.

52.1% students were from Science background, 47.9% students were from Commerce background.

The feedback collected from the students was analysed. The suggestions given by the students are related to the teaching learning process. The major observations are as follows.

Most of the students are satisfied with:

- 10) *Information expected competencies of POs and COs.*
- 11) *Follow up by the mentors.*
- 12) *Conceptual clarity by teachers.*
- 13) *SWOC analysis of students.*
- 14) *Students' engagement in quality development.*
- 15) *Use of student centric methods.*
- 16) *Participation in extracurricular activities.*
- 17) *Efforts for soft, life skills, development of employability skills.*
- 18) *Use of ICT tools by teachers.*
- 19) *Overall quality of teaching learning process.*

**4) Practical based learning and extracurricular activities**

➤ Extracurricular activities like NSS camps and celebration of various days, etc.

**5) The teachers should conduct interactive learning sessions more often, as it keeps the students on track**

➤ Various interactive learning sessions in the form of workshops, seminars, conferences, etc. were organized for the students.

**6) Guide students for skill development**

7) The college conducted certificate/add-on courses. The college also providing skill based education

**8) Courses can be more research oriented**

➤ The courses are designed by parent university. The college organized various research based activities to fill the gap between existing curricula and need of the students.

**9) The soft skills, life skills and employability skills should be incorporated amongst the students**

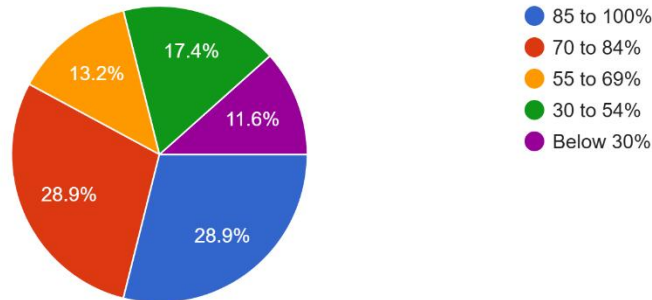

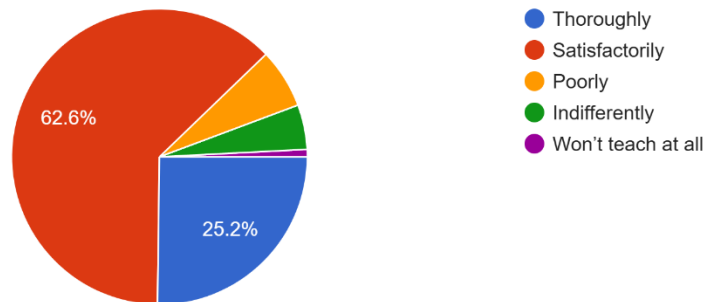
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

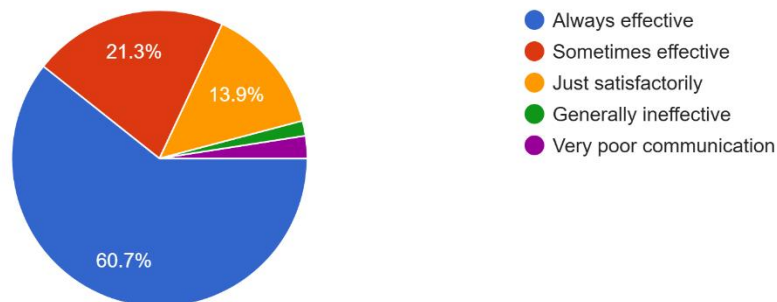
2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

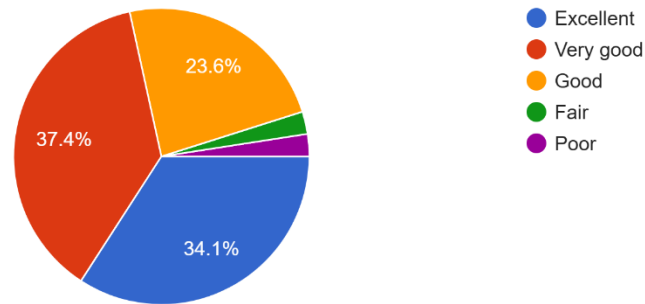
3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

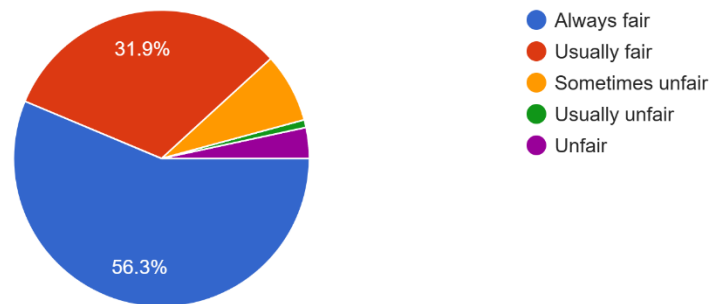
4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

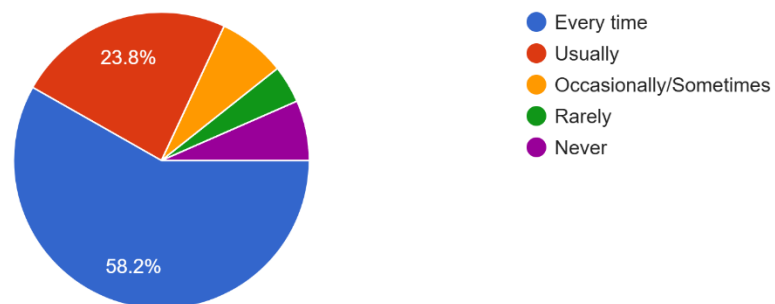
5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers

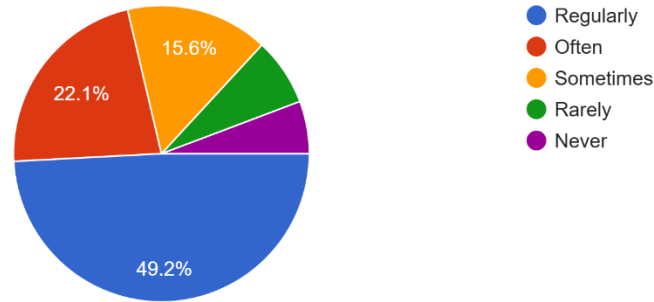
6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

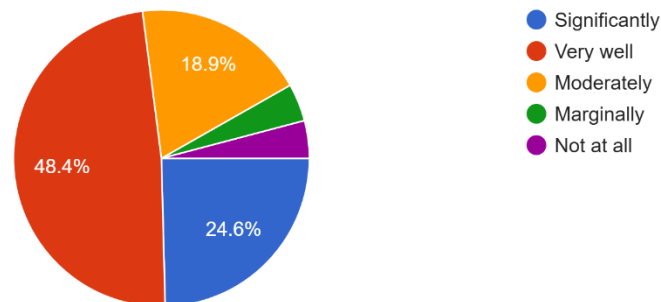
7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.

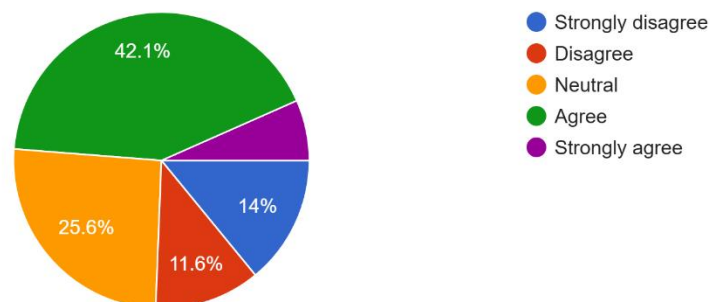
8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

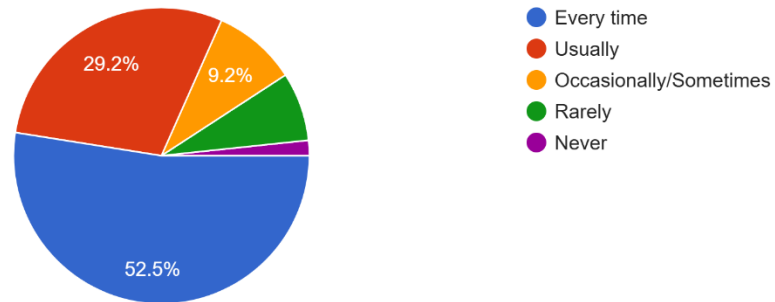
9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.

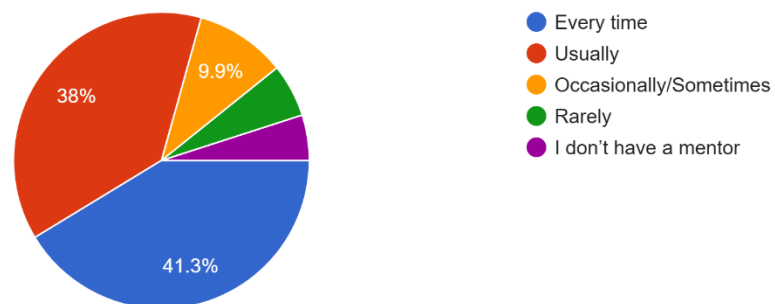
10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.

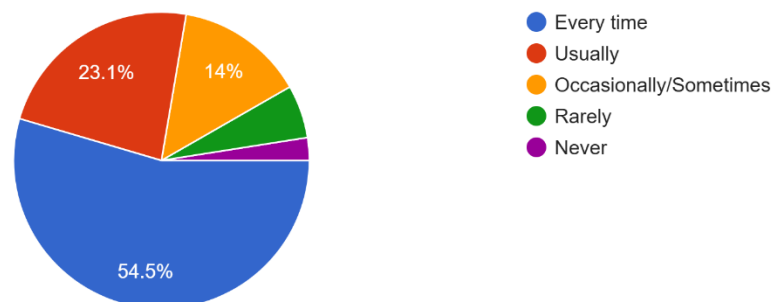

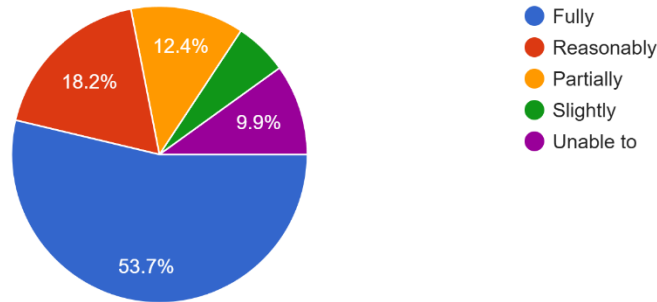


12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.

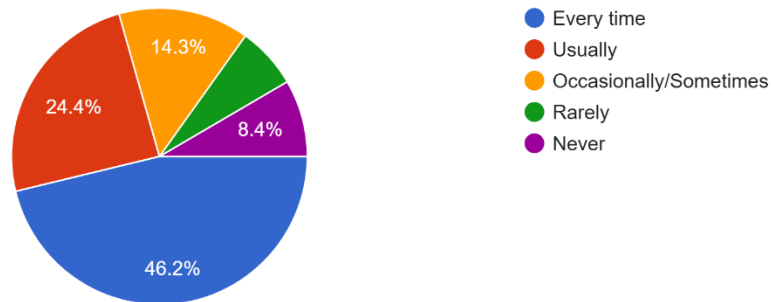

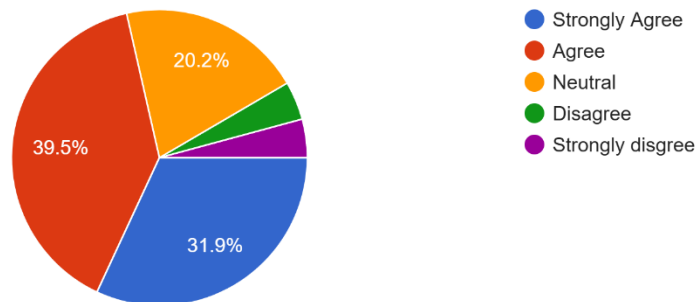
13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.

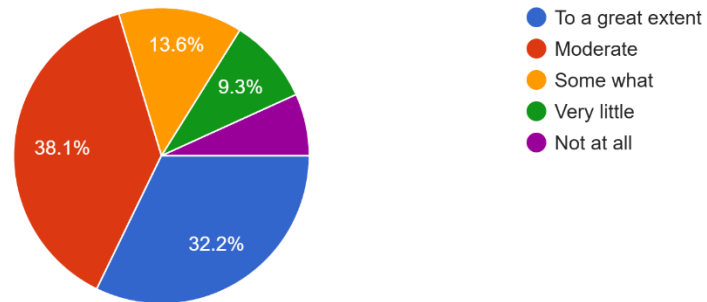


15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.

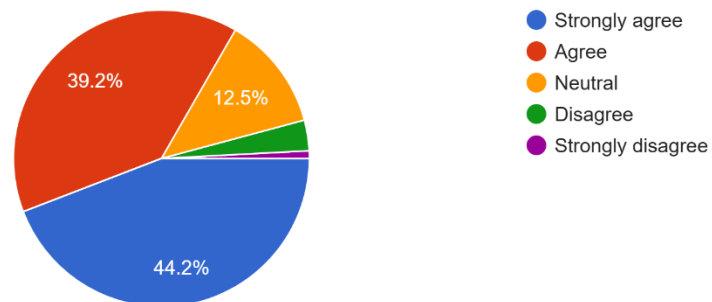

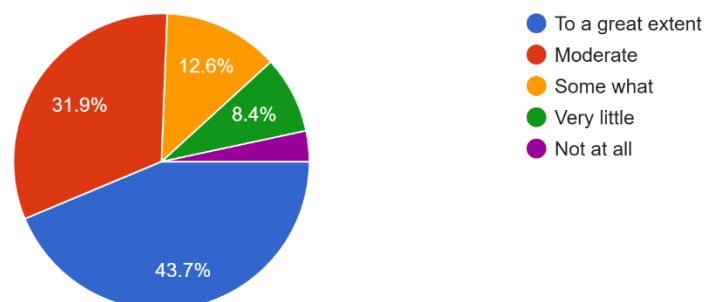
17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.

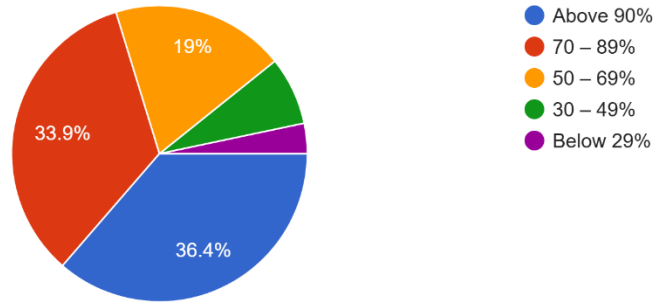
